This afternoon's site visit will involve a briefing on Nexus Energy's new HIPPS (High integrity pressure protection system) which is one of the first of its kind in the world. The HIPPS system is being completed at Cameron's Deer Park facility. It will be installed at the bottom of Bass Strait on the new Longtom field which is an entirely subsea to beach development.

HIPPS allows pipelines and associated downstream components to be rated for a lower pressure than the well shut-in pressure thereby providing potentially large field development cost savings. At this afternoon's event, Nexus will present and discuss the HIPPS system as well as the new Longtom Field Development which includes:

- 3 subsea wells and production trees in water depths of approximately 51–57 m.
- High integrity pressure protection system (HIPPS).
- 19 km offshore pipeline connecting the subsea wells to the Patricia Baleen offshore gas pipeline.
